This new volume of the PROSEA handbook series is the third one on medicinal and poisonous plants. The volume treats the least important species used as medicines or poison. The introduction gives some general remarks on the choice of species and collecting plants for medicinal use. A closing paragraph of this introduction gives some statistics on plant families to which the medicinal plants belong, their habit and habitat. The introduction is followed by an alphabetical treatment of genera and species. In total there are 285 genera and 540 species treated. The volume is concluded by a list of medicinal and poisonous plants with other primary uses, a list of references and several indices.

As all PROSEA-handbooks also this volume is produced along the well-known lines of the PROSEA layout. For those researchers interested in medicinal and poisonous plants the whole set of three volumes of the mega volume 12 is of great importance.
