III. STATE OF PROGRESS IN MALAYSIAN PLANT TAXONOMY

- Dr C.A. B a c k e r finished the MS on the Amaranthaceae for the Flora Malesiana; he started work on the Chenopodiaceae, Aizoaceae and other families.
- Mr R.D. H o o g l a n d, Leyden, finished the revision of Malaysian <u>Tetracera</u>, <u>Acrotrema</u>, <u>Didesmandra</u> and <u>Hibbertia</u>. He will soon start to work on Wormia and Dillenia.
- Mr M.R. H e n d e r s o n is writting a popular study called "Malayan Wild Flowers", to appear in instalments in the Malayan Naturalist.
- M.J. Le a n d r i, sous-Directeur du Muséum, Paris, intends to revise the <u>Thymelaeaceae</u> for the Flora Malesiana.
- M.J. Arènes, Paris, will revise the Malphighiaceae for the Flora Malesiana.
- Dr W.R. Philipson, London, will revise the Araliaceae for the Flora Malesiana; he is engaged in working on some collections from New Guinea and the Solomons, and a revision of <u>Macklinlaya</u> (incl. <u>Anompanax</u>).

- The <u>Digitaria</u> monograph by Dr H e n r a r d (this Bull. p. 86) will be issued as a whole; not in 2 parts as originally planned.
- Dr P. V e r m e u l e n, curator of the Herbarium at Amsterdam, is revising the Apostasiaceae for the Flora Malesiana.
- M.J. W e i b e l, assistant in Botanic Gardens, Geneva, is working on Malaysian <u>Elaeocarpaceae</u> and intends to elaborate gradually this family for the Flora Malesiana.
- Prof. Dr F. M a r k g r a f, Munich, has agreed to revise Gnetaceae for the Flora Malesiana.
- M.J. Pichon, Paris, intends to revise the Apacynaceae for the Flora Malesiana.
- Mr M.R. Henders on's revision of the genus Eugenia in the Malay Peninsula occupies the 1st part of vol. 12 of the Gard. Bull. Singapore.
- Dr H.N. M o l d e n k e is prepared to revise the <u>Verbena-ceae</u> for the Flora Malesiana; he has already made considerable preparations for this revision.
- Mr E.J.H. C o r n e r has agreed to revise the genera <u>Ficus</u>, <u>Artocarpus</u> and <u>Pandanus</u> for the Flora Malesiana. He will start with the most formidable work, a revision of <u>Ficus</u>. For this study he has assembled, prior to World War II, a large collection on spirits.
- Dr J. M o n a c h i n o, N.Y., will start a revision of the species of Rauwolfia (Apoc.).
