

IV. EXPEDITIONS AND OTHER FIELDWORK

Malaysia — Results of the expedition to the Belum Forest Reserve, Perak, are given in the Malay. Nat. J. 54 (2000) 147–269.

Sumatra — E. Djunaedi, A. Nurkayadi, Harti, S. Hartini, A. Slamet, and J. Surjati, (Kebun Raya, Bogor) conducted fieldwork in Bukit Rimbang (W Sumatra) between 14 March and 3 April 2001. 99 numbers of living plants were collected.

Mr. Amirudin, A. Hidayat, A. Kosasih, R. Subekti, R.N. Susetyo, and Syamsudin (Kebun Raya, Bogor) went to Danau Tujuh Kerinci (Jambi) between 14 March and 3 April 2001. 87 living plants were collected.

Mr. I. Andri, R.N.A. Kosasih, M. Mardjuki, U. Sahrudin, C. Sumirat, and Suradi (Kebun Raya, Bogor) conducted fieldwork in the Siberut National Park (W Sumatra) between 16 April and 6 May 2001, and collected 103 numbers of living plants.

Mr. R. Ahmad, I.P. Astuti, T. Daradjat, Slamet, Sutrisno, and Tachrodin (Kebun Raya, Bogor) conducted fieldwork in Bukit Duabelas Natural Park (Jambi) between 16 June and 6 July 2001, and collected 105 numbers of living plants.

Java and Bali — Dr. H. Wiriadinata (BO), S. Hoover, and J. Hunter (New England Tropical Conservatory) visited several mountains, e.g. Halimun National Park, Gede - Pangrango, Burangrang, Takuban Perahu, Salak, Malabar, Patuha, Ranca Upas, Kencana to study West Java *Begonia* and its ecology between February and March 2000. 50 specimens were collected.

Ms. D. Arifiani (BO) went to the Cibodas Botanical Gardens during her mentorship programme to collect Lauraceae in May 2000. 15 specimens were collected. She also visited the Mt Halimun National Park, W Java in January 2001. 80 general specimens were collected. She was on Mt Slamet and Mt Lawu, C Java between April and May 2001. 100 specimens were collected.

Mr. Hamzah, N.W. Utami, and Dr. E.A. Widjaja (BO), D. Sunu, and three students of the University Jendral Soedirman visited in May 2001 the Temanggung and Wonosobo Districts to collect black bamboo of *Dendrocalamus asper* and to study its population density. 10 herbarium specimens were collected and 600 plant stock have been cultivated in Purwokerto and Bogor to study its propagation for conservation purposes. Also 10 dried leaves have been collected for molecular study.

Kalimantan — Ms. F.I. Windadri (BO) conducted fieldwork in Tabalong, S Kalimantan, by helping to make an inventory of lichen and bryophytes supported by the European Union, between 17 March and 5 April 2000. 452 numbers of specimens were collected.

Mr. M. Amir, R.K. Hadiaty, Purwaningsih, and T. Uji (BO) went to Muara Kendawangan Nature Reserve (W Kalimantan) between 28 June and 16 July 2000. About 200 numbers of specimens (145 species) were collected.

Ms. H. Rustiami (BO) went to Batulitjin, Banjarbaru, S Kalimantan between 24 January and 9 February 2001. 181 numbers were collected.

Dr. Rugayah and A. Ruskandi (BO) visited Bukit Bangkirai (E Kalimantan) between 31 January and 20 February 2001. 180 specimens were collected. They went again from 7–18 September 2001. 90 specimens were collected.

Ms. F.I. Windadri (BO) went to Bukit Bangkirai (E Kalimantan) from 4–13 February 2001, and collected 369 specimens of bryophytes.

Mr. Dodo, Isro, Muzaeni, E. Safei, Suherman, and Suparta (Kebun Raya, Bogor) went to the Betung Karihun National Park (W Kalimantan) from 18 June–8 July 2001. 194 living plants were collected.

Sulawesi — Dr. H. Wiriadinata (BO) went to Lore Lindu National Park between November and December 2000, for his floristic studies. 400 specimens were collected. He and Ramadhanil (Univ. Tadulako, Palu) went there again between May and June 2001. 244 specimens were collected.

Mr. E. Fatimah, S. Hidayat, E. Suparta, I. Supriatna, I. Suwanta, and Sarifudin (Kebun Raya, Bogor) went to the Poleopali National Park (S Sulawesi) from 18 June–8 July 2001, and collected 111 numbers of living plants.

Lesser Sunda Islands — N. Utami, H. Rustiami, D.S.H. Hosein, and Nurdin (BO) conducted fieldwork in the Watu Ata Nature Reserve, Flores, from 1–20 May 2001. 126 numbers of specimens, 12 simplicia for chemical analysis, and 10 artefacts for ethnobotany were collected.

Mr. Hamzah and Dr. E.A. Widjaja (BO) went to the Bajawa District to collect and study the black variety of *Dendrocalamus asper* and its population density from 10–29 October 2001. On the way back they also collected bamboos in Bali (Panglipuran, Tigawasa, and in the Botanical Gardens Ekakarya). 24 specimens were collected and also leaves for molecular study and 155 plant stock have been propagated in Boawae, Bajawa, for propagation study towards conservation.

Papua (Irian Jaya) — Mr. T. Triono (BO), R. Johns, T. Utteridge (K), E. Wally (MAN), and O. Kasmin (PTFI) went to Tembagapura (Freeport concession area: Port Said to Grasberg and Ertsberg, including Wanagon Valley) from 3 March–13 May 2000. 125 numbers of plants have been collected.
